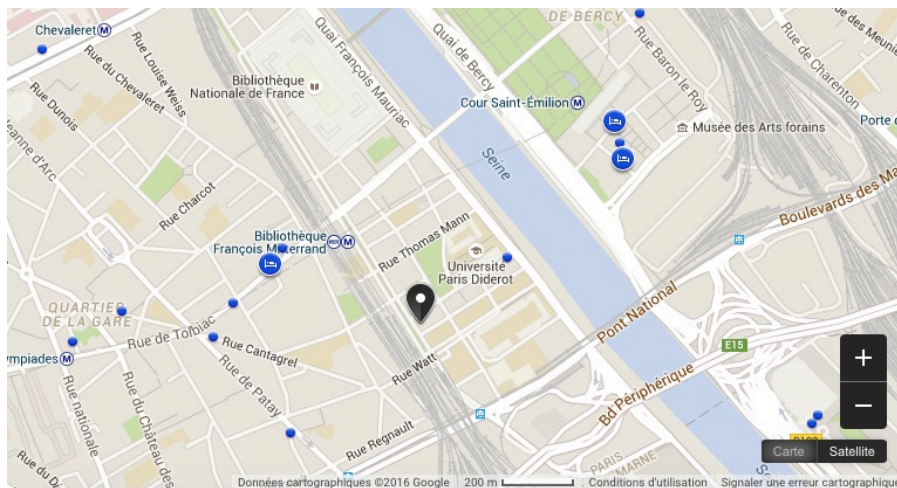

### DAY 1 Monday, 4 July 2016

Arrival at accommodation

- Advisors from abroad have rooms at ***Park & Suites Paris Grande Bibliothèque***

#### Transportation from the Orly airport to the hotel:

The shuttle bus *GO C Paris* from *Orly airport* (the entrance C, stop 6 for those arriving at South terminal; arrival level entrance C, stop 7 for those arriving at West terminal) to the *Pont de Rungis Aéroport* station (every 15 minutes, about 10 minutes, 2.5 euros). From the *Pont de Rungis Aéroport* station, you can take the train *RER C* to the nearest station to the hotel *Bibliothèque François Mitterrand* (every 10- 15 minutes,

about 25 minutes, 3.8 euros). From the stopping point to the hotel takes 3 minutes on foot.

#### Transportation from the Charles De Gaulle airport to the hotel:

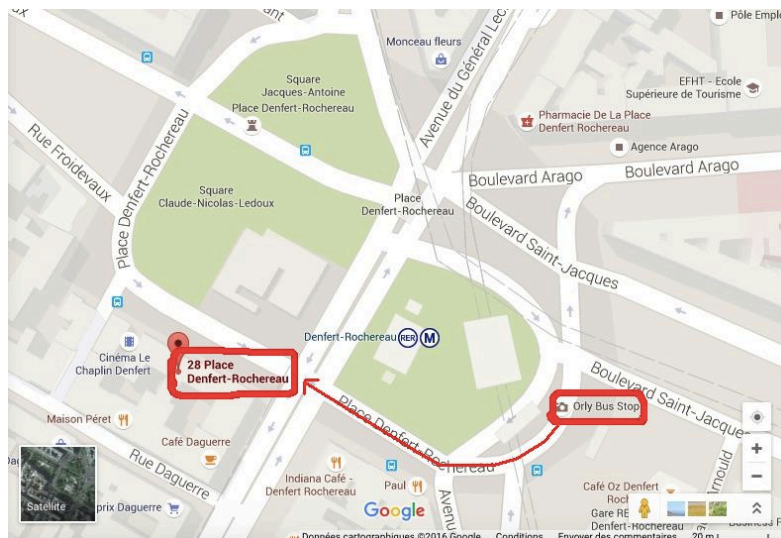
The train *RER B* is available from the CDG airport. You can get off 1) at the *Châtelet Les Halles* to change to the metro line 14 till *Bibliothèque François Mitterrand*, or 2) at the *Saint-Michel Notre Dame* to change to the *RER C* till *Bibliothèque François Mitterrand*. Also, there is a shuttle bus *Roissybus* arriving at *Opera* (every 15-20 minutes depending on the time, the fare is 11 euros, about 1 hour). From *Opera* to the hotel, take metro line 7 and change at 1) *Pyramides* to the line 14, 2) *Châtelet* to the line 14.

#### Transportation from the Orly airport to the hotel:

*Orly bus* from *Orly airport* (the stop *Orly Sud* or *Orly Ouest* depending on the terminal you take) to the *Denfert-Rochereau* station takes for about 30 minutes (7.7 euros). The bus runs every 10-15 minutes. From the stopping point to the hotel takes 3 minutes on foot.

**Transportation from the Charle De Gaulle airport to the hotel:**

The train *RER B* is available from the CDG airport directly to the *Denfert-Rochereau*. It takes about 35 minutes, and the fare is 9.75 euros. Also, there is a shuttle bus *Roissybus* arriving at *Opera* (every 15-20 minutes depending on the time, the fare is 11 euros, about 1hour). From *Opera* to the hotel, take metro line 7 and change at *Châtelet* to the line 4.

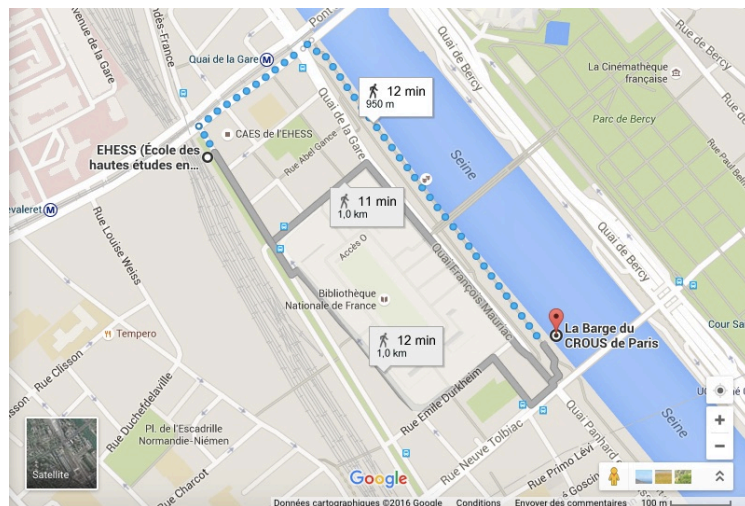

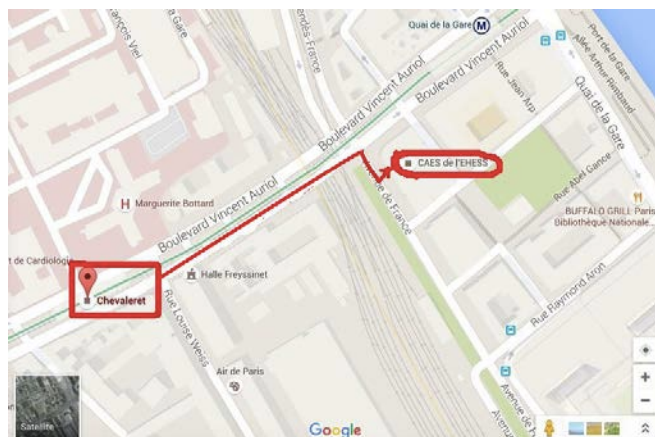

(see and cliqe the metro map below)



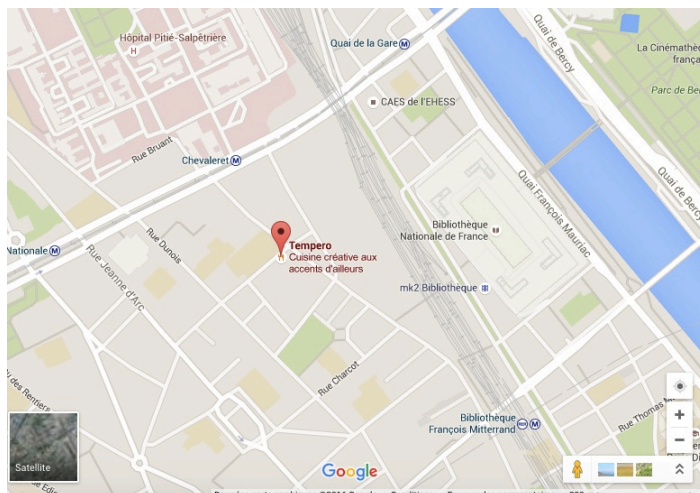
From the metro station *Chevaleret* to EHESS (190 avenue de France, 75013, Paris), about 5mnt on foot

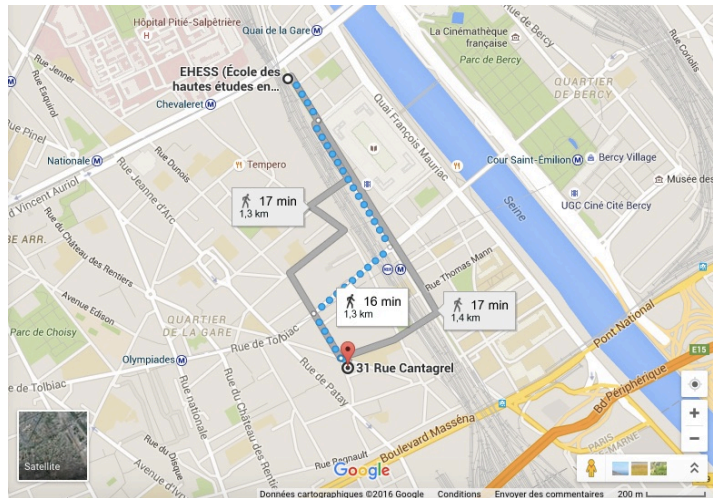
